


#### Welcome to India

A land of ancient culture...., the cradle of great religions...., the home of a nation that has sought God with relentless desire in deep meditation and silence...., in hymns of fervent devotion...., a land of Rishis and Gurus and Vedas.... A land of diverse languages and traditions...

Let me share with you a little history. Dominican sisters of the Presentation responding to the invitation put their first step in Indian soil in 1971. They journeyed from one single com-



munity to a Region under the leadership o Sr. Mary Patricia Sullivan. The Region of India had one community and 13 sisters when it was established on 26th of July, 1975. The Province decided to shift the Regional headquar-

ters to Bangalore in 1978. Sr. Patricia was elected Provincial in 1979 and Sr. Dorothy was elected Provincial in 1984. With great trust and confidence Sr.Ines Mercedes then Superior General entrusted the Presentation in India in the hands of the Indian sisters. Following the examples of Sr.Patricia and Sr.Dorothy

who walked before them, they ventured ahead to build Presentation on the foundation that they had built, with their sweat and blood, and with the selfless gift of themselves, they guided the sisters from far ahead. The Indian sisters responded with generosity and dedication.





Sr Joanna Fernandes was elected Provincial of USA in 1989. She is a gem of a person with full of life. She is a person who is touched by the abundance of life, loves unpossessively, spontaneously and joyfully. With her life she proclaimed that "I have come to give life and give it abundantly". Maya, the Superior General and the council saw it fit to gift the sisters in India with the freedom by allowing them to grow to a Vice province and to become themselves with their gifts and talents as well as their limitations and poverty with the grace which accompanied them. The Vice Province of India has 59 sisters serving in 8 communities in 4 States of India. The animation of the Vice Province was entrusted into the capable hands of Sr. Vimala Vadakkumpadan and her team of Councillors. In 1998 Sr. Vimala Vadakkumpadan was re-entrusted with new team of Councillors. We had 11 communities in 9 dioceses in 6 different states of India. Sr Vimala, a woman of prayer brought

down immense graces upon the province. Just like power plug she drew the energy of love from the Divine and transmitted it to all around her and brought a lot of life around her. She was hardworking, courageous, and talented. Being cheerful, friendly and sociable she made everyone feel at home in her company. She have a special concern and love for each sister in the province. She was generous in sharing her time and talents with anyone in need especially her valuable service in the province.



Sr. Mariamma Paul Ollukaran was entrusted with the animation of the Vice-Province in 2004. The passion and commitment with which she lived her life, the determination and courage with which she led our sisters, her personal care and concern for each one of the sisters, the creativity and the love for God and His people was really inspiring and challenging for all of us. The journey continued for another 13 years after it became a Vice Province in 1996. Korean Mission which was part of USA was added to the Province of India in 2007. Sr. Mariamma Paul Ollukaran was appointed as the first Provincial of the Province of India

in 2009. The Province grew to 18 communities in 14 dioceses in 8 States of India and Korea. Sr.Mariamma is a wonderful woman and an instrument in the hands of God. She offered her services at different levels of formation, administration and Education. As the animator of the Province Sr. Mariamma's dedication and selfless service is an inspiration for all of us. With

courage she led the Province. Each one experienced her love and care personally. We thank the Lord for the person of Sr. Mariamma. May His spirit continue to bless her with the gifts of wisdom and discernment as she is in the General team of animation of the congregation.

Sr. Philomina Vengachottil was elected Provincial in 2014. She led the Province of India for 5 years with much dedication and commitment. She led the province in the right path with truth and justice. She was a dedicated, committed and responsible person with a sincere,



humble and human heart. She was very sensitive to the needs of the sisters and of the province.

#### Jeevadhara Community

Kerala, a small coastal state with green and lustious vegetation, a land of coconuts and paddy fields, rivers and back waters, a land of festivals and rich cultural heritage welcomed our first sisters in 1971. Kuttikad, a a Forane Parish which lies below the hilly and forest boundary of Trissur district belongs to the diocese of Irinjalakuda. It is 25 kilometers away from the Diocesan headquarters.



The Foundation Stone for Jeevadhara Hospital and the Convent was laid on 19th March, 1971. With the arrival of Sr. Jos Mary Mooken on June 9, 197 in Kuttikad, the first Indian Sister to return India after her formation and the arrival of Sr. John of the Cross (Sr. Dorothy Ruggiero) on August 27, 1971 they moved to Doctors' quarters as a community. It helped them to supervise the construction. September 17, 1972: The blessing and inauguration of the new building for the Convent, Chapel and Health Centre by Bishop Joseph Kundukulam of Trichur Archdiocese.

The Indian sisters continued to come back once they finished their formation and professional studies and the community started to grow. As we scroll down through these pages of our history, our hearts are filled with gratitude to the Almighty God ...We

thank you, God of all mercies ...God of the history...God of the covenant... for your fidelity and love... and the faithfulness and commitment of all who have played an active role to make

this history through their loyalty, dedication, and hard work. This wonderful occasion of the 50th Anniversary is a special time of thanksgiving for all those who have contributed to the life and success of our foundation from the very beginning and especially throughout these 50 years of its history.





Jeevadhara..... stream of life, which began to flow in 1971 continues its journey with ever more enthusiasm to its destiny. Even though the care of the sick was the original project of Jeevadhara, over the years it has evolved. The charism of Marie Poussepin is kept alive with the same spirit

and channeled through various ministries.

Following the example of Blessed Marie Poussepin who dedicated herself to educate the poor girls of her time, Jeevadhara opened its doors for young girls who due to financial or other reasons are unable to continue their education. They find a home away from home in Jeevadhara. They continue their study in St. Sebastian's Higher Secondary School Kuttikad, St. George's L.P. School, Pariyaram and St. George's U.P. School Thoombakode.

Reading he signs of the time and recognizing the call of the Church, Jeevadhara Community collaborated with the diocese and other congregations in rendering the services to the poor through AVARD (Apex Voluntary Agency for Rural Development), to the sick through St. James Hospital, Chalakudy, Education of the youth in through St. George's L.P. School, Pariyaram. Hostel facility for the working women and college going young women, Grammar and spoken English classes for the youth, Counselling, are various ways in which the community reaches out in service.

Jeevadhara Family Renewal Centre aims at the Transformation of the families, the basic units of the church into missionary communities to build up the kingdom of God. Its mission is to equip the Christian families to fulfil the missionary responsibility entrusted to them through Baptism. To empower the individuals and families to radiate the joy of the Gospel by actively participating in the life of the church and the society. From 2005 JFRC conducted many Couples Retreats, Youth and Children Retreats, seminars, workshops, etc.

Service to the parish includes teaching of Catechism, animation of Family Units, animation of pious associations, family visits, etc.

#### St. Joseph: Mirror of Patience; A man of Action!



On December 8th, 2020, Pope Francis promulgated an apostolic letter titled "Patriscorde" (with a heart of a Father), extending the celebrations for the 150th anniversary of the declaration of St. Joseph, the Patron of the universal Church to the whole of the year 2021 granting various indulgences to this anniversary. This proclamation was desired by Blessed Pius IX precisely on 8th of December 1870. The document of the Congregation of Cult (rites) which does not bear the signature of the Pope for reasons of political control, is addressed to the Urbi et Orbi (to the Town and to the World) to mean that St. Joseph, by divine will extend to the whole world. In fact, from the beginning of his history, having become by divine call to guard the first-born Son of God, Jesus of Nazareth, made Saint Joseph the man predestined for the task of guarding. Pope Francis, in his apostolic letter, uses delicate

and affectionate terms to describe Saint Joseph: "Beloved father, father of tenderness, father in obedience and acceptance, father with creative courage, worker, and man always in the shadows ..." Certainly, in this year dedicated to him we will all have the opportunity to taste what has already been and will still be written about Saint Joseph

We don't know a lot about Joseph- we know that his Father's name was Jacob and that he was the husband of Mary. We know that he was a carpenter and that he lived in Nazareth. We know that before he and Mary lived together, after their engagement, he found that she was pregnant and instead of shaming her or causing scandal, he decided to divorce her quietly. The Gospel tells that he did this because he was an upright man, a man of principles.



We also know that he was a righteous man who followed the law: He observed religious laws - we know he went to Jerusalem for the Jewish festivals. We also know that Joseph had dreams. God spoke to him through his dreams and he believed these dreams. What's also interesting to me is that nowhere in the Gospels as well, we ever hear anything Joseph says. He never says anything. But he's a man of action: he does what the angel tells him; he takes Mary as his wife; he goes to Bethlehem; he finds a place to stay for the night; he takes his family to Egypt... He's a man of action- not a man of words. At the same time, Joseph is "an accepting Father," because he "accepted Mary unconditionally" — an important gesture

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even today, says Pope Francis, "in our world where psychological, verbal and physical violence towards women is so evident." But the Bridegroom of Mary is also the one who, trusting in the Lord, accepts in his life even the events that he does not understand, "setting aside his own ideas" and reconciling himself with his own history.

Joseph's spiritual path "is not one that explains, but accepts" — which does not mean that he is "resigned." Instead, he is "courageously and firmly proactive," because with "Holy Spirit's gift of fortitude," and full of hope, he is able "to accept life as it is, with all its contradictions, frustrations and disappointments." In practice, through St. Joseph, it is as if God were to repeat to us: "Do not be afraid!" because "faith gives meaning to every event, however happy or sad," and makes us aware that "God can make flowers spring up from

stony ground." Joseph "did not look for shortcuts but confronted reality with open eyes and accepted personal responsibility for it." For this reason, "he encourages us to accept and welcome others as they are, without exception, and to show special concern for the weak."

St. Joseph's obedience is often something that comes up in conversations about him. As Scripture tells us of how obediently St. Joseph responded to God's direction in caring for Mary and Jesus. However, a virtue that goes hand-in-hand with obedience is patience. St. Joseph did not demand to know the full plan laid out step-by-step before God's chosen time. We must imagine he was anxious when he could not find a fitting place for Mary to give birth for Jesus. We must imagine how anxious he was to hear that his family was being hunted. But he patiently awaited the revelation of God's plan, submitting himself completely to God's providence.



St. Joseph was a model of all artisans, because he was fully talented, hard-working, with an eye for beauty and quality. It also reminds us that we are called to put our talents and creativity to use. You might think that being the foster father of Our Lord and Savior and the spouse of Our Lady would be enough to ask, but God blessed St. Joseph with a trade and he practiced that trade with integrity and skill. We are sanctified in our daily lives by seemingly "little things" we do to glorify God.






Farmer-Nature's Friend


#### Diaconate Ordinations and Upcoming Priestly Ordinations
