Very often she told me, "Daisy, I pray for you". The last thing I requested her was to pray for Jeevadhara Family Renewal Centre and the many young couples and youth whom I am accompanying. I am sure that she is doing it.

Sr. Josephine, you served well through all the responsibilities entrusted to you. A good and faithful servant, now enter into the joy of the Master. I thank God for your life journey and your vocation, so that in all things God may be glorified. Sr Josephine, I consider it a privilege to be part of your life and journey to the end.

Good morning and welcome to each one of you for this celebration of the birth into the eternal life of our dear Sr. Josephine. Our heartfelt gratitude to all of you who are gathered here to memorialize, pray, and bid farewell to our dear Sister. In the name of the Dominican Sisters of the Presentation, I welcome each one of you and very specially, our dear Sr. Josephine's family members. Thank you for the gift of Sr. Josephine to us. She has been a real gift to us, especially during her last 50 years of life as a Dominican Sister of the Presentation.

"No one after lighting a lamp puts it under the bushel basket, but on the lampstand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in Heaven." (Mt. 5: 15-16)

That is exactly who Sr. Josephine was in her committed life ... a light that burned selflessly till the last minute, drawing and empowering all those who came in contact with her- her students, friends, colleagues, sisters, and family... She motivated and inspired us all, to achieve our goals and thus led us to God Himself, the true light. She was a lively, cheerful, and friendly person. No one will forget Sr. Josephine, once he or she has met her.

Sr. Josephine was born on 16.06.1948 in Aranattukara, Trichur, Kerala, to a loving family, as the eldest daughter of Mr. Joseph and Mercy Kuruthukulangara. She has two brothers and four sisters as siblings. You filled her with an overflowing love which she reciprocated to you: her family, friends, and all of us.

After her pre-degree studies, in 1968 she left for

the United States to become a Dominican Sister of the Presentation and she made her first profession on 13.06.1971 along with Sr. Mary Urumpumkuzhiyil and other companions. She did her Bachelor's Degree in Sociology from South Eastern Massachusetts University. She made her Perpetual Profession on 21.05-1978 in Kuttikad, Trichur, Kerala. She did her Bachelors in Education from Mount Carmel College, Kottayam, Kerala.

As a Teacher, Sr. Josephine has given herself to thousands of students in Carmel English medium school, Chalakudy, Christ School, Bangalore, St. Jude's school, Khargone, SSB School, Bangalore, St. Basil's School, Basti, St. Xavier's School, Soganur, St. Mary's School Bhadravathy, and ST. Dominic School, Karehally.

In whichever community Sr. Josephine was in, she actively participated in the parish activities and especially in teaching catechism to children. As a religious, Sr. Josephine was truly faithful to her religious commitment and tried to live it, following the rules and regulations of the Congregation. With dedication, commitment and responsibility, she tried to do the various services and ministries entrusted to her, such as: Aspirant mistress, Local Superior in different communities, Regional Councillor, Vice-Provincial Treasurer and Vice Provincial councillor. While she was serving as treasurer in St. Dominic School Karehalli, Shimoga Dt., on December 4, 2021, Sr. Josephine came to Bangalore for cataract surgery. After getting an appointment for her surgery on January 8, 2022, she was to return to her community on December 15, 2021. But on December 13, she started with gastritis for which on the 14th she was taken to St. Philomina's hospital, Bangalore. After consulting the doctor, she came back to the community. But her stomach continued to be upset and as a result, she was taken to St. John's Medical College Hospital where she got admitted the very next day.

Sr. Josephine underwent laparotomyy on December 24, 2021, and later, it was

confirmed that she was suffering from the last stages of cancer of the stomach which was painful and shocking news for all.

Her smile was her greatest gift to me and those around her, as we struggled to accept the sad reality of her illness. Sr. Josephine was not perfect – she had her fair share of human weaknesses, limitations, and imperfections like the rest of us...and how deeply she was aware of this but, this is all now healed and transformed in Christ.

I want to thank those who accompanied Sr. Josephine during her last days. Dr. Rakesh and all the doctors and staff of the Oncology department, ICU, and ITU of St. John's Medical College Hospital. So gentle, caring, concerned, and loving was your approach to Sr. Josephine! The words 'Thank you' seem so inadequate but I know that our God who sees your good work will reward you abundantly. Sisters of the four communities in Bangalore, members of Karehalli Community, Sr. Lisa, and a few sisters from other communities offered themselves generously to support and care for Sr. Josephine, even to the minute details. Her brothers and sisters, nephews and nieces, cousins, and other members of her family, through their physical presence and also through their virtual presence strengthened her, comforted her, and consoled her. Her friends, students, colleagues, and others assured her of their care and concern. While she was nursed and cared for, in the convent, she was lucky to have the assistance of Dr. Susheela,

friends of the community, and her own friends. Many priests attended to her spiritual needs. Our sincere 'thank you' to each and every one.

Accompanying Sr. Josephine during her sickness and last days was probably one of the most touching, and formative experiences of my life. No complaints... accepted all the pain.... Consoled me many times.... Helped in making decisions, concerning the treatment when it was so difficult...Her courage in the face of adversity was an inspiration for me, for all the sisters, and for all who knew her.

The last moments of Sr. Josephine's life here on earth were moments of grace and peace. On 23- 03-2022, around 6 pm Sr. Josephine's breathing began to alter and become heavier. All the sisters of the four communities with some of her family members stood around her praying. We experienced that the Lord to whom she had committed her life, had come for her, His bride. She took her last breath at 7.44 pm in total surrender to her Lord.

I know that all of us feel the emptiness, the great loss. I wish to extend our heartfelt sympathy and condolences to all and especially to all her family members. I know that you will miss her terribly. She must be now looking at us from above and interceding for all of us to her Lord. May she enjoy being with her Lord forever! May she enjoy eternal life, as we continue to pray for her and ask for her intercession!

Dear Josephine, Pray for me




Gratitude is the memory of a heart

It is an honor for me to write this tribute to Sr. Josephine a mentor, a sister, a teacher, an administrator, an animator, and a companion. In whatever role I knew and experienced her, she stood apart as someone special to me at different times of my life!

On March 23, 2022, evening at 6.30, I got a call from Sr. Reema saying Sr. Josephine is serious, As we started our evening prayer we placed Sr. Josephine at the feet of the Lord and said "Thy will be done". At 8.15 pm I got the call from Sr. Reema saying that Sr. Josephine is no more. There were no words I just kept quiet. It took a few minutes for me to convey the message to the sisters in the community. Though I knew I have to soon face this reality, when the reality came it was very hard to accept. She was very committed, thus as a young girl, I could approach her at any time. We would be waiting for her at door, to pour out the stories of the day, while she returns from Christ school. Patiently she listened to us then at the end with a sigh and say I could plant a few banana saplings, instead of caring for you all, then with a broad smile, she will say go and do your work. She was passionate about enabling us, showed us the way, and made us realize the importance of compassion, selflessness, and freedom. You made us know the value of respecting others as we seek respect for ourselves by others and regardless of our race, language, religion, or culture. You appreciated us in small activities and taught us to be humble, to be respected through our work and values. You are one among many; you are the star, among many who made a difference in my life.

Once again I got the privilege to be with her as I was in Khargone for my community experience, where I understood the depth of community life, how a community can be bound in spite of all our indifferences. Later she was my companion to Dr. Nancy for alternative treatment. She was so caring for me and often told me you are young take care of yourself and was very attentive to me. The last time I met her was in St. Johns Medical College, on her sickbed. As I just reached her bed she enquired, how am I doing with my fever? I had nothing to tell her ...just said I am ok and praying for you ...She told me to take care of my health ... Of course, I will miss her counsel and her friendship, and her love and care for me personally. Her physical presence is gone, but the lessons she taught me in life will remain.... 





On August 6, 1221, less than five years after the Holy See formally confirmed the founding of the Order of Preachers, Dominic died in Bologna, the site of one of the Dominicans' principal university houses and schools of theology. Just before his death, Dominic called first all the novices around him and then the oldest members of the Order, to whom he gave his last testament: "Have charity in your hearts," he said. Practice humility after the example of Jesus Christ, and make your treasure and riches out of voluntary poverty. You know that to serve God is to reign, but you must first serve Him in love and with a whole heart. It is only by a holy life and fidelity to your rule, that you can do honor to your profession."

With her high faith, in high prayer, with a lot of peace in her soul and in her heart, and with the satisfaction of her duty accomplished, Marie Poussepin, 90, understands that it is time to go and meet her Creator and eternal love. She and the Lord met at a spiritual feast on January 24, 1744. From that day until today, her daughters have assumed her inheritance with responsibility, discipline, dedication, and much love, remaining faithful to his ideal.

Her daughters, the Dominican Sisters of Charity of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin, remain faithful to the proclamation of Jesus Christ through the service of charity. This three-century fidelity is proof of the holiness of its Foundress: The Church officially recognized it on November 20, 1994, in the solemn act of her beatification.

Lord, merciful Father, You made Marie Poussepin, a faithful disciple of Jesus Christ, in faith and charity; grant us to imitate his contemplative listening and devoted to the Word of God, for humble and generous service to brothers and sisters, and listen, through her intercession, the supplications that we address to you in our needs. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

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
